Let us compare our praying to Elijah's praying: 1 Kings 18:41-46; James 5:16-18.

Earnest Praying:(1 Kings 18:41, 42)

- 1. Elijah prays (v. 42; James 5:18).
- 2. Elijah prays based on a promise and faith (1 Kings 18:1), but why?
- 3. Prayer is God's ordained way of giving us what he promises.
- 4. Elijah prays "earnestly" (v. 42; James 5:17).
- 5. Postures for prayer: Kneeling (Dan. 6); Bowing (Neh. 8; Exod. 4); On one's face (Matt. 26:39); Standing (Luke 18:11).

Expectant Praying (1 Kings 18:43, 44)

- 1. Elijah keeps praying even when "there is nothing" (v.43).
- 2. Illustration of "7up."
- 3. Acts 12:5-16.
- 4. Develop a procedure for expecting answers to prayer.

Enhanced Praying (v. 45, 46)

- 1. V. 45-46.
- 2. Great praying involves us in great ministry.
- 3. Enhance prayer with personal involvement.

Conclusion: "We have not because we asked not" (James 4:2)
