

THE VOLUME OF MUSIC IN WORSHIP

JONATHAN WISDOM

MANAGING SOUND FOR WORSHIP

Whether using a full band, piano, guitar, or organ for musical accompaniment in worship, sound system management can be a challenge. At NCC, we seek to steward the technology God has provided as best we can for the praises of God and the good of our congregation. We think intentionally about setting aspects like audio, video, and lighting to these ends. Each component has its primary goal of serving our church's worship, even while our congregation may possess a diversity of personal preferences or sensitivities. Our hope is to achieve the greatest common encouragement. For sound levels, here are a few specific goals:

- Theologically, we want to push the volume to reflect the greatness of God and the call for "loud" music, singing, shouts and rejoicing unto him with "all our might" (Ps. 33, 150; 1 Chr. 15:28).
- Functionally, we seek to set the volume levels loud enough to support the primary instrument in the church, the congregation's voice, without being too loud that it drowns our people out. The communal aspect of singing is so powerful that we want people to feel confident to sing but also be able to hear the unified congregation's voice, and not have their hearing damaged. We are always after this "sweet spot."
- Technically, we monitor the audio levels with decibel meters and equalization graphs. When our levels are too low they drain us and if they are too high they distract us. We feel confident that our current average levels are appropriate for the goals we are seeking to achieve. That being said, there will inevitably be moments where sound is louder or softer as our musicians, vocalists, and technical volunteers express their gifts dynamically.

Acts 2:42 "And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." We see that the earliest believers merely weeks after the death and resurrection of Jesus, "devoted themselves" to fellowship. Have you ever considered how essential fellowship is to helping you grow in your faith? In the verse above it is listed alongside such things as teaching and prayer.

New Covenant Church exists as a body of believers that is brought together by a life-changing faith and a loving fellowship. Most of us can speak specifically about the change that the word of God and the work that the Holy Spirit has wrought in our lives. We can speak of a life-changing faith because our lives have been changed.

But the Christian life is not isolated to a single event or experience. We see in Acts 2:42ff that the real life-changing faith that the first disciples had led to daily actions in their lives. Home Ministry groups at New Covenant exist in order to facilitate loving fellowship between brothers and sisters in Christ. We spend time together because we want to spend time together. We fellowship with one another because we need to pray for one another. All scripture is God-breathed and is useful. One simple, achievable application from this verse would be for *every member at New Covenant to be connected to a home ministry group*. We should do this for two reasons: 1) It would help us all to experience the loving fellowship that believers have in Christ 2) It would help folks who are new to the faith, new to the area, or new to the church to be warmly received into the fellowship that we all love.




We are well on our way in the construction process and we want to thank you for your giving, praying and now, <u>forbearing</u> during the mess of construction. The demo is in full swing and a new foundation is being laid. This isn't the fun part of the process, but if you don't get the foundation right, a lot could go wrong! Continue to pray for the process to go smoothly and the workers to stay safe.

Immediately following the completion of the Admin Connector we will redo our parking lot. This is an expensive and very necessary project, and like our bricks and mortar construction, we will do this with cash. We expect refurbishing our existing parking lot to cost approximately \$250,000. Beyond that, we need additional parking, as we have had the same number of spaces ever since 1991 when we built our first building.
