Transitional verses: Gen.50:26 & Exod. 1:1 (2550 years in the book of Genesis to 80 years in Exodus) "Exodus" means "going out". God's "out of slavery" deliverance (3:7,8; 6:6; 12:27,51; 15:13-16; 20:2).

The Calling Out of Egypt (1-18)

- 1. God multiplies (Gen. 12:1-3) from 70 (Exod. 1:5) to approximately 6,000,000+ (Exod.1:7; 12:37).
- 2. Everything happens just as God promises (Gen. 15:13,14).
- 3. The call of Moses (Exod. 2-4) and God's promised presence (3:12, 14; Isa. 7:14; Matt. 1:22,23; 28:20).
- 4. The 10 Plagues (Exod. 5-11): God's absolute authority (7:5).
- 5. The Passover (Exod. 12-18). Our only hope for redemption: God accepts a substitute.

The Covenant at Sinai (19 -24)


- 1. Our first revelation of the Ten Commandments (i.e., "the covenant" Exod. 34:28; Deut. 4:13).
- 2. Our proof of redemption is through our covenantal obedience (1 John 2:4).
- 3. Note the importance of the preface to the Ten Commandments (Exod. 20:1-2).
- 4. The final chapters (21-24) illustrate the out working of the Ten Commandments.

The Construction for worship (25 - 40)

Application Questions:

- 1. How does God's sovereign rule over all nature (think "10 plagues"), Pharaohs, Kings, Nations, and authorities affect us?
- 2. God has every right to choose for himself a people. What are the implications regarding man's ability to choose God in the book of Exodus?
- 3. God has the ability to defend and care for his people and does so. What are God's thoughts toward you in light of the book of Exodus?
- 4. Man must be "passed over" when God comes in judgment of sin. Where then is our hope?
- 5. Redeemed people prove themselves redeemed by their worship and obedience of God. What fruit of this is most evident in the people of God today?
- 6. Consider our motivation for obedience to God's law. How can we increase our motivation thereby increasing our obedience?
