1. Psalm 111, 112, and 113 all begin with the Hebrew word "hallelujah." They are psalms of praise and thanks to God — Psalm 112: Praise for God's covenant blessings.

1. Blessed and mighty children (v.2).
2. Outward and inward wealth (v.3).
3. Comfort and continued ministry (v.4).
4. Wellness (v.5).
5. Stability (v.6-8).
6. Honor (v.9).

## The Apostate and God's Covenant Blessings (v.10)

1. Grief or vexation.
2. The gnashing of teeth and melting away.
3. Perishing desires.
