Proverbs

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Name and Author

- 1. The name was chosen by its own description (1:1). A proverb is a type of literature providing a brief pithy statement of counsel.
 - 2. Solomon is the main author (1:1; 10:1; 25:1; 1 Kings 4:29, 31,32). The last two chapters are authored by Agur (30:1) and Lemuel (31:1).

Purpose and Theme

- 1. Key words: wise and wisdom used some 80 times and fear of the Lord, recorded 14 times.
- 2. The purpose is that of teaching God's people to live wisely for God's glory (1:2-6).
- 3. The first duty in achieving this purpose: fearing God (1:7).
- 4. What is the "fear of the Lord?" (1:7).
- 5. What is the difference between typical proverbs and Proverbs found in God's Word? (24:11).

Learn to Love: What we must learn to love:

- 5. Be "on guard" for your heart (4:23).
- 6. Rule at the pleasure of God (8:15,16).
- 7. Plan several generations out (13:22).
- 8. Speak gentle and wise (15:1-4).
- 9. Seek to know God's purposes (16:4).
- 10. Realize that respecting God keeps us from evil (16:6).
