## Survey of Titus

- 1. Titus 1:1-5. Paul had left Titus in Crete probably as an interim pastor. Crete was a small island just south of Corinth; and Paul had already sent Titus to Corinth to seek generous giving (2 Cor. 8:1-15).
- 2. After Titus' ministry in Corinth, he goes to Crete to organize the church there.

## **Main Points and Application**

- 1. Church structure: Paul leaves Titus in Crete "to set the church in order" (1:5). What order?
  - 1:5; Acts 14:23→ Establish rule by a plurality of elders
  - 1: 9, 14; 2:1; 1 Tim. 3:14, 15→
  - 1:10, 11→
  - 1:14→ Silence teaching by myths and commandments of men
  - 1:15, 16→ Make clear distinctions between Christians and nonChristians

Why is church government important for the worship and work of the church?

- 2. *Commandments of men issues, 1:14.* Titus is told "don't pay attention to myths and commandments of men". Why should we have this concern today?
- 3. Salvation issues:
  - Teach in accord with sound doctrine, 2:1-15
  - How are we saved, 3:1-5)
- 4. **Dealing with others**: Don't try to win a factious man; "reject a factious man after a first and second warning" (**Titus 3:10**, 2 Tim. 3:1-5). What do you think of this statement? What does a factious person look like or act like? Why not try to just win them? What kind of things do false teachers teach?
  - The presence and consumption of alcohol of any kind is shameful, sinful and a sign of the last days
  - Wearing hats indoors is a sign of a rebellious heart
  - Enjoying music with a syncopated beat is lustful, unholy and irreverent
  - Anyone who does not have a multitude of children is probably under a curse from God
  - There are higher classes of Christians and the most holy home-school
  - All dating is sinful, courtship is okay
  - You can be defiled from things outside the body, from the world, from TV, books, dolls, amusements (Mark 7:1-23)
