- 1. Peter's audience: scattered churches (1:1, 2).
- 2. Outline according to Church Growth Needs
 - 1. *Trinitarian Worship* (1:3-12). We "bless God" with speech, financial offerings, singing, playing instruments, etc.
 - a. Preaching (1:12, 25; 4:6). Long for the word of God (2:2).
 - b. Sacraments: Baptism (1:2; 3:21), Communion?
 - c. Benediction (1:2; 5:14).
 - d. Prayer (1:17; 4:7).
 - e. Priesthood of believers (2:5); Every member a valued minister to God (2:7,9,10).
 - f. Christ's Preeminence (1:1,2,3,3,7,11,11,13,15,19, etc.)—hope in Christ's righteousness.
 - 2. Discipleship/Sanctification—Holiness by grace (1:2,13,14,15; 5:12)— moral responsibility (2:11,12; 4:2) and submission to God's authority (2:13,18; 3:1).
 - 3. Evangelism Program (2:9; 3:15), (2Cor.5:18-21)—God's initiative not man's
 - 4. Loving Fellowship (1:22; 2:17; 3:8; 4:8; 5:14)—Greeters, mercy ministers, etc.
 - 5. Christian living in the home: Husband/wife relationships (3:1-7).
 - 6. Suffer for Christ (2:20-21; 3:14,17; 4:12-19; 5:10)—submission to authorities.
 - 7. *Gifts Employed:* Develop Speaking and Serving Gifts (4:10-11).
 - 8. Elder-Rule (5:1-5).
 - 9. Satanic Warfare (5:8-9).
- 3. What do we not find mentioned as necessary for church growth?
- 4. 1Peter was most likely written during the Neronian persecutions. Most scholars argue for a date around 63 or 64 A.D.
- 5. 1 Peter has a specific purpose: exhorting and testifying to Christians concerning the true grace of God and the need to stand firm in it (1 Pet. 5:12).

Main Points and Application

- 1. Should 1Peter be viewed from the perspective of church growth or church comfort?
- 2. Where do we learn to do the things, we call "church things," the stuff we do at church and in church?
- 3. Evaluate what we call precious in life with the revelation from Peter:
