SUFFERING SMYRNA

Revelation 2:8-11 David Rountree

- 1. A wonderful message of comfort for suffering saints.
- 2. Polycarp was the Bishop of Smyrna and burned at the stake in AD 155.
- 3. How do we suffer for Christ's sake in America?
- 4. Since we are of Christ we must suffer (John 16:33; Phil. 1:29; 2 Tim. 3:12).

We Are Not Hidden (v. 8-9)

- 1. Christ knows our afflictions of pain. How does this help?
- 2. God's world of order is never out of order. Jesus is overseer in charge from beginning to the end; he says he is "the First and the Last" (v. 8).
- **3.** Christ knows our afflictions of **poverty** (v. 9b).
 - **Heb.10:34**, Christian property was plundered yet rich in the glorious fruit of God's grace (cf. Matt. 6:20; 19:21; Luke 12:21).
 - **2 Cor.8:9**, poverty in Christ is short-lived.
- 4. Christ knows our afflictions of **profanity** (v. 9c).
 - Who are these Jews Christ is referring to? (John 8:37-47)
 - Who are some people today that call themselves Christians but are rather instruments of the devil?
 - The Jews who rejected Christ have been declared "the synagogue of Satan" (v.9; John8:44) and are no longer his people. The people of God are those of faith in Christ (Gal.3:7, 26-29).

We Are Not Hopeless (v. 10)

- 1. "Do not fear" (v.10; Matt.10:28).
- 2. What suffering is not our fault? Why do we need to remember this?
- 3. The phrase "ten days" means "a full period of time" yet a definite period of time. "Ten days" could have been the term limit for Roman prisoners.

We Can Be Honored (v. 10, 11)

- 1. To receive a "crown of life" (v.10) is an honor (1Cor.9:24-25).
- 2. No words of rebuke for sinful practices. A pure church? God honors purity (cf. Matt. 5:3,8).
- 3. We will not be hurt by the second death (v.11; 20:14).
- 4. If we will not suffer for Christ, we will not live with Christ.
