- 1. Don't use the obscure to interpret the plain.
- 2. Remember the first audience had a Sunday Sabbath.
- 3. The fourth commandment was never defined as ceremonial.
- 4. Paul's writings must maintain consistency.

Rightly interpreting Colossians 2:16

CONCLUDING APPLICATIONS:

- 1. Sabbath keeping is not disregarded as ceremonial.
- 2. Neither the Sabbath nor any other day will make you holy.
- 3. Heb. 10:24-25 rebukes the wrong interpretation of Colossians 2:16.
- 4. We need to keep Christ's Sabbath command.
