The Doctrine of God in Covenant (Exodus 3:1-22)

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- 1. God remembers his covenant after 400 years (Exod. 2:24; 12:40).
- 2. God reintroduces himself as the "covenant keeping God" (Exod. 3:1-22).
- 3. The Purpose of Exodus 3: Establishing our covenantal relationship with God.

A Holy God (v.1-5)

- What is appropriate for us to lay aside in God's presence?
- A holy God we must revere (cf. Lev. 11:44; 19:2; 20:7, 26; 1 Pet. 1:15,16).
- Does God take you just the way you are?
- Consider Psalm 99:1-9. What is this passage telling us to do and why?

An Historical/Faithful God (v.6, 16)

- An historical God we can depend upon.
- "Leading the way since Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob."

A Compassionate God (v. 7-9,16)

- A compassionate God we should love and worship (cf. Exod. 4:31).
- Hebrews 4:15-16.
- Exod. 4:31.

A Helping God (v.10-22)

- A saving helping God we must make known.
- Verse 12 and verse 14 use the exact same Hebrew verb: hayah ("to be"). See also, Rev. 1:8; 4:8.
